TUESDAY'S SENIOR MOMENTS...

Tuesdays at Bartram Trail are a lot of fun for the senior men and one of the reasons for that is the lovely young lady working the snack bar on Tuesdays. Leslie Hickson is blessed with a good nature and endless patience for the foibles of senior men golfers; a breed apart from "regular" men. The committee gets to the course when it opens so Leslie has just enough time to plug in the coffee pot when she is deluged with orders for breakfast wraps. That starts a steady stream of guys wanting something to eat, drink or just some attention. Leslie bears it all with a smile and never a cross word. With Robby Watson offering a hot dog and coke for \$1.50, Leslie's work just begins with the breakfast orders. I would imagine she sells 60 or 70 senior specials on Tue. That's a lot of hot dogs. Golf has always consisted of three parts; pre golf when the golfers get together and tell stories about the last round, the actual round, and post golf when they get together and tell stories about today's round. Leslie really makes the pre and post golf more enjoyable for all of us and not a golfer shows up on Tuesday that he doesn't go speak to Leslie. We're glad you're there Leslie.

This month started off with one of the coldest Tuesdays of the year and we still had 32 diehards show up and play. You can't keep a good golfer off the course. Ed Brown shot a 70 on the 17th of March and pulled 43 points. Ed is one of our better golfers and an all around athlete. Ed was a talented pitcher in his younger days and attended Georgia Southern on a baseball scholarship. He has a very smooth and repeatable golf swing but it is all Ed Brown. I have tried to mimic his swing for obvious reasons and it is uncopiable. Only Ed can do it. Victor Briggs grew up with Ed and says Ed has been taking money from him on the golf course since high school. Keep on plugging Ed.

Also this month, George Hill eagled number 11 and Max Field eagled number 13. Good golfing guys.

We also welcomed three new members this month; Carl Pilcher, Worley Pierson and Bob Lane. Carl said he had apparently terminal golf swing problems, took lessons from Robby Watson and now is an A player. Good enough for me; I will be getting signed up. I have played with Bob Lane for a number of years at Forest Hills and one of the things I always remember about Bob when I see him is that he graduated from West Point in 1947. He is still smacking the ball down range pretty good. Welcome to the group guys.

On a more somber note, one of our long standing members said today he would not be coming back. The reason; slow play. That is too bad since slow play is unnecessary and really a little impolite. A golf course is a shared resource, just like a racquetball court or tennis court. On a good day 200 folks will share the golf course with you. The USGA has established time standards for play that ensures all who share the course have a good time. Unfortunately, not everybody stays focused on the golf course. It is easy on a racquetball court; when your hour is up, somebody raps on the door and tells you your time is up. You can't say "I never learned to play fast, I need another 15 minutes." It doesn't work that way in racquetball and it shouldn't work that way in golf. The primary reason for slow play, I believe, is lack of awareness of where your group is in relation to everyone else on the course. It is NOT how long you stay posed over the ball before hitting the shot. It IS things like driving up to the tee box and having one player sit in the cart entering scores, and one sitting in the cart because he had a double bogey and "he's not up". When you get to the tee box somebody should be teeing off immediately. It is also marking a two foot putt instead of finishing it off, it is meandering to your ball in the fairway, without clubs, while your cart partner hits his shot. Take a couple clubs with you and hit your ball as soon as he hits his. Play ready golf, you do not have to be "up" to hit a shot. If none of your group is ready and you are, hit it. I have seen guys go down a ravine where a ball would be clearly unplayable, look five minutes and come back up waving the Top-Flite they rescued. Come on guys, think it over. If it will delay play unnecessarily, let it go and I will give you a Titleist when you get in. If folks would just stay aware of their position on the golf course and adjust, if necessary, slow play could be conquered. Play ready golf, keep up with the group in front of you and adjust if you get out of place. If you see a hole open in front of you and a group standing in the fairway behind you it is time to adjust. I ask your cooperation in killing slow golf.

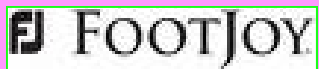
